
PROJECT PHASES:

- REPORT- report finished product to Boy Scouts of America Board



Town of Ticonderoga Capital Reserve Re-establishment Considerations 7/16/19

After a brief discussion about Capital Reserves with Derrick, and in preparation for the July Financial Board meeting (7/25 @ 2PM) here are a few considerations regarding what we might recommend to the Town Board for reestablishing the Water & Sewer reserves. The Reserves currently sit in the Central Water (SW06) and Central Sewer (SS05) Districts:

<u>Equipment Reserves</u> (Water or Sewer) - For the purchase and/or repair of motorized vehicles or heavy equipment vehicles such as: Automobiles/trucks, loader, backhoe, cart or dump truck. Vehicles defined as any conveyance moving on wheels, runners, tracks or the like.

Current Water Equipment Reserve Balance approx. = \$187,000 Current Sewer Equipment Reserve Balance approx. = \$119,000

Combine Repair & Infrastructure Reserves into a Repair Reserve (Water or Sewer) – For significant repairs to equipment (non-vehicular) or infrastructure (cost over \$100,000*)

<u>Sewer Repair Reserves</u> – For Sewage, is the system of pipes, chambers, manholes etc. that conveys sewage or surface runoff (storm water, meltwater, rainwater) using sewers. It encompasses components such as transmission lines, receiving drains, manholes, pumping stations, storm overflows, screening chambers and treatment plant of the combined sewer or sanitary sewer.

Current Sewer Repair Balance approx. = \$ 98,000 Current Sewer Infrastructure Balance approx. = \$225,000 TOTAL Sewer Repair Reserve = \$323,000

Water Repair Reserves – For Water, is the system of water supply, transmission, treatment, storage, water resource management or flood prevention. It encompasses man-made or built infrastructure components and the natural infrastructure such as rivers, lakes, ponds, streams, groundwater aquifers and the watersheds that serve or are affected by water.

Current Water Repair Balance approx. = \$ 76,000 Current Water Infrastructure Balance approx.. = \$189,000 TOTAL Water Repair Reserve = \$265,000
