Key Project Updates

1. Master Water Project

a. AES is working with the contractor to with warranty issues. We are making favorable process.

b. Working closing out paperwork, delays at the state level related to Covid-19 may delay actual paperwork, but that should not negatively impact the Town.

2. Water Meter/Planning Project

a. Water District Consolidation: AES is currently reviewing all parcels within each district to review to determine any issues. Once that is completed the consolidated districts can be determined. AES is working with Matt Fuller to sort through any issues before they are presented to the Town. 6-11-20 Update: Status ongoing, we are preparing for Town discussion June 16th.

b. Report (in progress) to include funding planning for meters and longer-term planning for Mnt Defiance Tank replacement, water transmission upgrades (to reduce dependence on Baldwin Road), and other distributions system upgrades. Report expected to be completed May 31st. 6-11-20 Update: Received an extension from DEC until July 31 for report so that we could review the final report at out June 16th committee meeting. On-target

3. Potential Project: Veterans Road Water Main

a. AES is going to work with the Town and County to develop the report necessary to apply for the grant for this work. The Town and County will complete the income survey. After the grant application is submitted, the County will work with the Town to issue an RFP for engineering so that the engineering work can be reimbursed by the grant program. The goal is complete the design (if the grant is awarded) this winter and then bid and construct the water main in 2021 in conjunction with the bridge replacement project. **6-11-20**

Update: Town is working with County on letters, AES has drafted report pending completion of income survey. Still in-progress.

4. Potential Project: LSLRP Grant

a. AES is developing a work plan and schedule to submit to the DOH to meet requirements to begin utilizing the grant. The grant is slated to be closed out by May 2021 but can be extended for a maximum of one year. Total grant funds available are \$518,962. 6-11-20 Update: We will present the plan at the June 16th committee meeting.

Key Project Updates

1. WWTP Project

a. Work is essentially complete, remaining work is on final punch list.

2. Portage Bids

a. Project is essentially ready to go (contractor is ready to go).

b. From what we can gather from various agencies, all grants are still on, but there are delays in payments. No guarantees one way or the other. Loan money appears not to be affected at this point.

c. The Portage project will spend approximately \$3,000,000 this year, with approximately \$5,000,000 spent next year.

d. With the way the programs work you will be spending mainly loan money this year.

e. If one of the grants were pulled for some reason we believe that would be able to manage scaling back the project, not without some cost or sacrifice (particularly you may have patched roads, not a rebuilt road), but the project schedule and scope are such that at the end of this year we could reconsider the actual scope if needed before the Town starts spending the grant money.

f. Ultimately at least a portion of the job is required (the sanitary and storm separation), so if we were to cancel we would have to rebid at least a portion and costs would likely go up.

g. At this point the contractor has agreed to hold bids until the end of June. After that it is up to them on whether or not they want to hold them longer. There is likely a real cost to them to hold bids as material prices fluctuation and we are losing prime construction season.

h. If the board elects to move forward, the parecon meeting will be held on June 12th. I would expect to see the contractor on site within two weeks.

3. Portage Bond Resolution update needs to go through tonight to ensure all funding (including grants)

are accepted and approved by the funding agencies.

4. Planning

a. We will be working on future wastewater planning, but this will take a bit longer due to the pandemic. We will be monitoring for any upcoming stimulus money that might benefit the Town. 6-11-20 Update: Status ongoing, we will resume discussions once in person meetings begin again.

WHEREAS, pursuant to proceedings heretofore had and taken by the Town Board of the Town of Ticonderoga, Essex County, New York, pursuant to the provisions of Section 202-b of the Town Law, it has been determined to be in the public interest to provide for a certain increase and improvement of the facilities of the Sewer District Nos. 2 through 11 (together, the "Districts; each a "Sewer District" or "District") in the Town of Ticonderoga, Essex County, New York, at a maximum estimated cost of \$13,440,885.41, consisting of the construction of improvements to and reconstruction of the wastewater treatment plant, collection system and related facilities, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith;

WHEREAS, it is anticipated at this time that the apportionment of such cost between the following Districts shall be based on an equation, the numerator of which shall be the equivalent dwelling units (EDU's) for the particular district and the denominator of which shall be the total EDU's for all of the following Districts with the current EDU's, subject to change in the future, as follows: Sewer District No. 2 (Park Avenue) (79.6 EDU's), Sewer District No. 3 (Alexandria Avenue) (54 EDU's), Sewer District No. 4 (Homelands) (26.3 EDU's), Sewer District No. 5 (Village) (1461.11 EDU's), Sewer District No. 6 (Commerce Park) (110.2 EDU's), Sewer District No. 7 (Delano Point) (26.1 EDU's), Sewer District No. 8 (Baldwin Road) (41.5 EDU's), Sewer District No. 9 (Black Point Road) (143.35 EDU's), Sewer District No. 10 (Hearts Bay) (currently 0 EDU's), Sewer District No. 11 (Routes 9N & 74) (36.25 EDU's), and Sewer District No. 10 (Hague Road) (15.15 EDU's); and

WHEREAS, a map, plan and report including an estimate of cost has heretofore been prepared in connection therewith and is on file in the office of the Town Clerk of such Town; and

WHEREAS, in order to undertake the improvements to the aforesaid facilities as described therein, it will be necessary to expend the sum of \$21,000,000, an increase of \$7,559,114.59 over that previously authorized for such improvements, and an explanatory addendum (Revised Table No. 6.2, Addendum 9) to said map, plan and report, originally dated September 3, 2015 as heretofore amended in 2016 and 2017, has been prepared and added thereto in connection therewith as to the increased cost; and

WHEREAS, said capital project has been determined to be a Type I Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, as to which a Full Environmental Assessment Form has been completed, and the additional costs described herein constitute a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.5(c)(2), in the aggregate which it has been determined will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to call a public hearing on the question of authorizing such increase and improvement of facilities of said Sewer District Nos. 2 through 11 at the revised maximum estimated cost; NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED, by the Town Board of the Town of Ticonderoga, Essex County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> A public hearing will be held at the Town Hall, 132 Montcalm Street, in Ticonderoga, New York, in said Town, on the 9th day of July at 6:00 p.m., Prevailing Time, on the question of increasing and improving the facilities of the Sewer District Nos. 2 through 11 in the manner described in the preambles hereof, and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same, and to take such action thereon as is required or authorized by law.

Section 2. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a copy of the Notice of Public Hearing hereinafter provided to be published once in the official newspaper designated for this purpose, and also to cause a copy thereof to be posted on the sign board of the Town, such publication and posting to be made not less than ten, nor more than twenty, days before the date designated for the hearing.

Section 3. The notice of public hearing shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A and hereby made a part hereof.
